For the Employer: Adrian Scales, Staff of the Non-Public Funds, Canadian Forces

TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE ARBITRATION BOARD

[1] On November 15, 2007, the Public Service Alliance of Canada requested the

establishment of an arbitration board in respect of all the employees of the employer

employed at the Canadian Forces Base Suffield, save those above the rank of

supervisor.

[2] Included with its request of November 15, 2007, the Public Service Alliance of

Canada provided a list of the terms and conditions of employment that it wished to

have referred to the arbitration board. The terms and conditions of employment and

supporting material are attached hereto as SCHEDULE I.

[3] By letter of December 18, 2007, the Staff of the Non-Public Funds, Canadian Forces

informed the Public Service Labour Relations Board that it was not opposed to

arbitration of this matter and it considered no additional matters to be outstanding at

that time. That letter is attached hereto as SCHEDULE II.

[4] Pursuant to section 45 of the Act, the Chairperson has authorized me, in my

capacity as Vice-Chairperson, to issue the present Terms of Reference of the

Arbitration Board.

[5] Accordingly, pursuant to section 144 of the Act, the matters in dispute on which

the arbitration board shall render an arbitral award in this dispute are those set out as

outstanding in SCHEDULE I and SCHEDULE II inclusive attached hereto.

[6] Should any jurisdictional question arise during the course of the hearing as to the

inclusion of a matter in these terms of reference, that question must be submitted

forthwith to the Chairperson of the Public Service Labour Relations Board, who is,

according to the provisions of subsection 144(1) of the *Act*, the only person authorized

to make such a determination.
